INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAM CONDITIONS OF ENROLMENT 2019

Cathedral College Wangaratta accepts Instrumental Music enrolments from students and parents on the provision that parents have read the conditions set out below:

- Y Tuition will be given for four terms as per school calendar and the Instrumental Music Coordinator schedules these lessons once a week across the majority of school year. Due to the many commitments of our College students, the following scheduling applies in 2019:
 - o Prep to Year 5 9 x 20 minute lessons per term
 - o Year 6 to Year 12 9 x 40 minute lessons per term
- Y Students need to buy or hire their instrument if they do not already own one. Please contact the Music Coordinator for further information.
- Y Fees are on a termly basis and are as follows:
Lessons will be charged at the end of each term with payment expected prior to the commencement of each new term. College Policy states that Fee debt not within an approved payment plan exclude student/s from extracurricular activities.
- Y A term's notice in writing is required if your child wants to discontinue their lessons.
- Y No make-up lessons will be scheduled. If a teacher misses a week, the fee for that week will not be charged.
- Y As per College policy parents must contact the school if there are planned absences from lessons for personal and non-school reasons. Lessons missed due to the pupil's non-attendance will be charged. Lessons will not be given during public holidays and school holiday periods.
- Y Examinations and competitions: The Head of Music will only enter a student for any examination or competition with the parents' consultation and consent. Generally, we do not expect students to sit external examinations.
- Y Young students in particular need to learn the "fun" of performing. To gain the maximum benefit from learning an instrument, parents are asked to encourage their child in regular performance times at home. Please ask your child if they would perform something for you at home that was learnt that day or in one of their previous lessons. Using the term 'perform' makes an enormous positive impact.
- Y Students are to adhere to the timetable given at the beginning of each term. Any issues with timetables are to be directed to the Instrumental Music Coordinator in the first instance.
- Y Middle and Senior School students are expected to follow the timetable and make their own way to lessons at the scheduled time; however, the instrumental teacher will accompany Junior School students to and from their classroom for lessons.
- Y The buying of books can be made by purchase order through the College. The Instrumental Music Coordinator will be notified and orders will only be placed when agreed to and confirmed by the parent/guardian.
- Y Many musical groups are planned for 2019, which will allow students more opportunity to use their instruments in performance and rehearsal throughout the year. Students learning an instrument are expected to participate in these instrumental groups as directed by the Music Department staff.
